
### **Coverage Report**

June 1st to June 30th, 2023

We compiled 33 publications related to the bilateral relationship between Mexico and the United States. From all the publications, 12% were written by Mexican think tanks, while 88% were written by United States think tanks. Baker Institute was the leading think tank with 7 publications, followed by AS/COA with 5 and Mexico Institute with 4. During June, the most mentioned topics were **Economy and Commerce** with 12 publications, **Democracy and Institutions** with 10 publications, and **Migration and Labor Mobility** with 5 publications.

The next figure shows the top five most mentioned topics.

#### **Economy and Commerce**

Within the topic of **Economy and Commerce** publications were oriented towards trade between the two countries and the trade agreements. In the context of nearshoring, many articles were focused on the supply chains such as the Milken Institute's report on strengthening the supply chains in semiconductors. The Wilson center, the COLMEX, IMCO, and the Baker Institute also analyzed the USMCA agreement. IMCO and the Wilson center focused on the regulations between the two countries, some of which have caused controversies such as the genetically modified corn. Also, the Baker Institute and the COLMEX released publications surrounding the opportunities and threats the free trade agreement exhibits, as well as a plan forward during these times of increased integration.

# ECONOMY AND COMMERCE RECENT DATA

The Milken Institute predicts that the semiconductor market will reach \$1 trillion USD in sales by 2023 because of the megatrends such as electric vehicles. This is a bipartisan industry which will greatly benefit both the U.S. and Mexico. (Milken Institute)

#### **Democracy and Institutions**

Regarding Democracy and Institutions, the State of Mexico's Governor's election was the most mentioned event. Although elections also took place in Coahuila, the significance of the State of Mexico is key for the development of the upcoming Mexican Presidential elections in 2024 due to its population's size, the biggest in the country, and to its historical importance. The State of Mexico had been governed by the PRI for almost 100 years; hence the triumph of Morena's Delfina Gomez, could represent an advantage for the 2024 Presidential elections.

# DEMOCRACY AND INSTITUTIONS RECENT DATA

A poll conducted in May showed that 75% of the State of Mexico's population stated that it would be best if the State's governing party changed. (AS/COA)

Claudia Sheinbaum leads the polls for Morena's Presidential candidate with 34% followed by Marcelo Ebrard with 22%. (AS/COA)









### **Migration and Labor Mobility**

During June, publications regarding this topic had a strategic character. The Council of Foreign Relations addressed the roots and historical development of migration from Central America and Mexico to the United States, as well as analyzing the foreign and domestic U.S. policies regarding migration. Also, the Baker Institute released an article regarding the potential of TN Visas and how they could help the U.S. labor shortage. As for the short-term publications, they examine the current illegal child labor within the immigrant population, as well as the Pew Research survey which questions the U.S. government's performance at the Southern border.

### Other topics

This month, there were also some publications on **Energy and ESG's** with a focus on the bilateral relationship. The Baker Institute published an article about Mexico's ambivalent climate policy because of the refineries being developed and the attack on the renewable energy market. The second publication is a podcast from Trade Talks and it touches on the change in battery and lead regulation in the U.S. which lead to Mexico collecting these batteries. The batteries have led to contamination of the air quality. The podcast reflects on the investigation done by Eric Verhoogen which found that this is affecting birth weight in Mexican babies. Both of these articles placed a lot of importance on the common goals Mexico and the U.S. have towards lowering climate change and taking measures to ensure this change.




### Relevant short-term events for the bilateral relationship

- Unlike last month's publications regarding **Migration and Labor Mobility** which emphasized the short-term event of the elimination of Tltle 42, this month's publications mainly addressed strategic issues such as the U.S. labor shortage and how new immigration instruments such as the TN Visa could help, as well as illegal child work, which is increasing among the coming immigrant population.
- Due to the North America Semiconductor Summit, publications within the **Economy and** Commerce category emphasized the possibilities of this industry for the region, as well as the need for ally-shoring. Although think tanks referred to the event, their publications were mainly strategic.
- Publications regarding **Democracy and Institutions** were mainly related to the Governor's election in the State of Mexico. They reported the polls and results; however, a deeper and more strategic analysis will be needed in order to understand the implications of the results for the bilateral relationship.

The next chart shows that 73% of this month's publications were related to short-term events, while 27% of them discussed strategic issues.

During this month, events such as the Governor's elections in two states in Mexico and the North America Semiconductor Summit increased the percentage of the short-term related publications. However, as it was stated before, a deeper analysis of the implications of a presidential win for Morena to the bilateral relationship, or the possibilities that certain policies could have in the region regarding the semiconductor industry.
